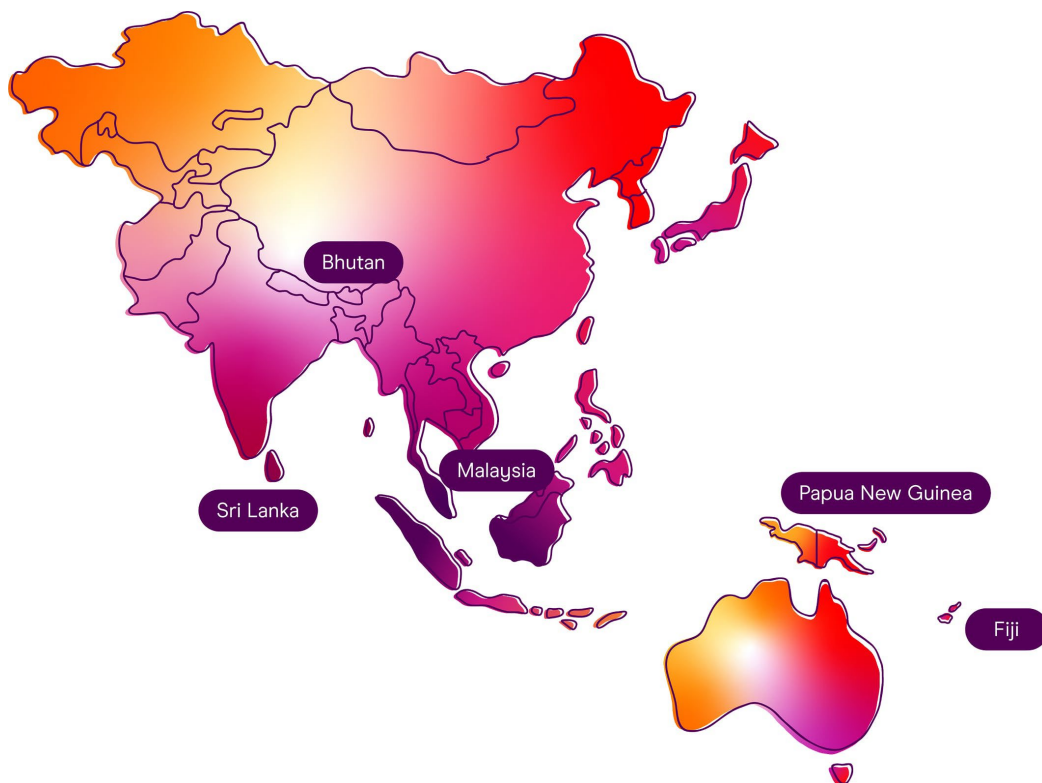
A gift in your Will is more than a donation — it's a lasting legacy.

Suggested wording for your Will

To include Health Equity Matters in your Will, we suggest the following wording:

We strongly recommend discussing your wishes with a qualified legal advisor to ensure your Will reflects your intentions.

Thank you. Let us know so we can acknowledge your generosity, keep you updated on our work, and make sure your gift is used exactly as you intend.

Frequently Asked Questions

Do I need to be wealthy to leave a gift?

Not at all. Gifts of any size make a genuine difference, and every contribution helps fund our work across the region.

Will my family and loved ones still be looked after?

Yes. Most people leave a gift to Health Equity Matters after providing for their family and loved ones first, whether that's a specific amount or a share of what remains.

Can I change my mind later?

Yes. A gift in your Will is not locked in — you're free to update your Will at any time as your circumstances or wishes change.

Do I need a solicitor to include a gift?

We recommend it. A solicitor or qualified legal advisor can help make sure your Will reflects your intentions and is legally valid, whether you're writing a new Will or updating an existing one.
